<u>HB560</u>	Ingle, Keri	Neglect	The Child Residential Home Notification Act: Would require child residential homes, those currently exempt from licensing, to register with the state and comply with minimum health and safety regulations. This legislation also mandates federal criminal background checks for all employees and volunteers. The intent of this law is to close loopholes which have existed in Missouri law for decades which have left children unprotected and vulnerable to abuse.

HB432	Kelly, Hannah	Child Welfare	Establishes the Birth Match Program, which orders data sharing between the Departments of Social Services and Health and Senior Services and the courts to compare birth reports with reports of parents who have been convicted of certain crimes or have a termination of parental rights in order to ensure the safety of the child and provide services, if needed.
<u>HB259</u>	Evans, David	Safety	Modifies provisions relating to sexual offenses. Changes the definition of "sexual contact" and it adds a coach, assistant coach, director, or other adult with a schoolaged team, club, or ensemble.

<u>SB136</u>	Rehder, Holly	Safety	Modifies requirements that school districts conduct criminal background checks for persons having contact with students including substitute teachers
