<a href="#">HB 2095*</a>	Kelly, Hannah	Child Abuse / Neglect	<p><b>*Missouri KidsFirst Legislative Priority*</b></p> <p>Modifies provisions relating to child abuse investigations in schools including repealing language directing school districts to investigate certain allegations of child abuse when the alleged perpetrator is a school professional. Also modifies the laws around school discipline to require parental notification and consent for corporal punishment to be used in schools.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>*Truly Agreed and Finally Passed in <a href="#">CCS#2 HCS SS SCS SBs 681 &amp; 662</a></i></p>
<a href="#">HB 2032*</a>	Lewis, Ed	Child Abuse/ Neglect/	<p><b>*Missouri KidsFirst Legislative Priority*</b></p> <p>Establishes and modifies provisions relating to child sex trafficking including allowing individuals under the age of 18 to provide an affirmative defense to the offense of prostitution. Also establishes the Statewide Council on Sex Trafficking and Sexual Exploitation of Children. <i>*Truly Agreed and Finally Passed in <a href="#">CCS HCS SS SCS SBs 775, 751 &amp; 640</a></i></p>
<a href="#">SB 775</a>	Thompson Rehder, Holly Schupp, Jill	Safety	<p><b>*Missouri KidsFirst Legislative Priority*</b></p> <p><b>*OMNIBUS*</b> Modifies provisions related to judicial proceedings. Includes HB 2095 (summarized above), revises the Sexual Assault Survivors’ Bill of Rights to clarify provisions related to minor victims of sexual assault, expanding the “rape shield” law to exclude prior sexual contact of both witnesses and victims in all parts of the criminal proceedings, expands the definition of “sexual contact with a student” to include coaches or club directors and prohibits individuals found guilty of child pornography possession from being present in certain locations</p>

<a href="#">HB 1585</a>	Murphy, Jim	<b>Safety</b>	Requires public schools to teach students the responsible use of social media
<a href="#">HB 1806</a>	Lewis, Patty	<b>Safety</b>	Specifies that a person commits the offense of endangering the welfare of a child if he or she fails to secure a firearm.

HB 1995	Richey, Doug	<b>Children &amp; Families</b>	Provides for protections for parental rights and transparency in public schools
HB 2008	Schwadron, Adam	<b>Children &amp; Families</b>	Establishes transparency requirements for learning materials and educational activities.
HB 2048	Coleman, Mary Elizabeth	<b>Children &amp; Families</b>	Simplifies the application form for certain public assistance benefit programs and allows certain periodic eligibility review forms to be submitted as an attachment to a recipient's state tax return.
HB 2136 HB 2238	Kelley, Ann Appelbaum, LaDonna	<b>Children &amp; Families</b>	Enacts requirements relating to suicide prevention education and information. Beginning in the 2022-23 school year, each school district may offer at least two hours of suicide prevention training for all practicing teachers
HB 2156	Perkins, Chad	<b>Children &amp; Families</b>	Modifies provisions relating to work requirements for the supplemental nutrition assistance program
HB 2189 SB 645	Coleman, Mary Elizabeth Koenig, Andrew	<b>Children &amp; Families</b>	Modifies and creates provisions regarding the use of certain training, instructional, and curricular materials in public schools and charter schools.
HB 2222 SB 729	McCreery, Tracy Schupp, Jill	<b>Children &amp; Families</b>	Creates the Missouri Earned Family and Medical Leave Act—creates new provisions of law relating to paid leave from employment.

HB 2441 SB 683	Toalson Reisch, Cheri O’Laughlin, Cindy	<b>Children &amp; Families</b>	Adds provisions relating to in-home licensed child care facilities. States that children who are related to the operator of a facility are not to be counted when calculating the maximum number of children allowed under the license.
HB 2374	Bosley, LaKeySha	<b>Children &amp; Families</b>	Extends coverage for mothers in the Show-Me Healthy Babies Program from 60 days to one year postpartum.
SB 935	Arthur, Lauren	<b>Children &amp; Families</b>	Modifies provisions relating to MO HealthNet eligibility, including providing twelve months continuous coverage for children.
<b>HB 1486</b>	Kelley, Ann	<b>Child Welfare</b>	Modifies and establishes provisions relating to the protection of children. <i>Support in part.</i>
<b>HB 1583</b>	Kelley, Ann	<b>Child Welfare</b>	Authorizes an income tax deduction for expenses incurred for providing respite care to children.
<b>HB 1745</b>	Dogan, Shamed	<b>Child Welfare</b>	Modifies provisions relating to the certification of juveniles for trial as an adult.
HB 1836	Wiemann, John	<b>Child Welfare</b>	Requires trauma-informed schools to keep incident records and provide notice of certain incidents
HB 1974	Murphy, Jim	<b>Child Welfare</b>	Establishes a rebuttable presumption that child custody arrangements that award equal parenting time are in the best interest of the child.
HB 2013	Kelly, Hannah	<b>Child Welfare</b>	Establishes provisions relating to licensed residential care facilities.
HB 2026	Unsicker, Sarah	<b>Child Welfare</b>	Establishes the Uniform Child Abduction Prevention Act.
HB 2623	Veit, Rudy	<b>Child Welfare</b>	Modifies provisions relating to required background checks of individuals employed by or associated with licensed residential care facilities, child placing agencies, or residential care facilities.
HB 2642	Kelly, Hannah	<b>Child Welfare</b>	Established the Uniform Unregulated Child Custody Transfer Act.
HB 2651	Lewis, Patty	<b>Safety</b>	Modifies provisions relating to guardian ad litem fees
HB 1482 HB 1578 SB 917	Stephens, Mike Schroer, Nick Burlison, Eric	<b>Health</b>	Modifies provisions relating to advanced practice registered nurses.
HB 2256	Doll, Jo	<b>Health</b>	Requires health care professionals that provide maternity health care services to, through the use of a validated and evidence-based verbal screening tool, screen for mental disorders and mental illnesses in all pregnant women as early as possible at the onset of prenatal care and throughout the pregnancy
HB 2399	Pollock, Suzie	<b>Health</b>	Modifies provisions relating to gender dysphoria and gender incongruence. <i>MO KidsFirst Opposes.</i>
HB 2649	Pollock, Suzie	<b>Health</b>	Creates provisions relating to gender transition procedures. <i>MO KidsFirst Opposes.</i>

SB 843	Moon, Mike	<b>Health</b>	Prohibits any physician, surgeon, nurse, or other health personnel from administering any hormonal treatment or performing any surgical treatment for the purpose of gender reassignment for a child under 18. <i>MO KidsFirst Opposes.</i>
HB 2180 HB 2411	Proudie, Raychel Person, Mike	<b>Human Trafficking</b>	Requires training on human trafficking conducted by the department of public safety to include instruction on victims' statements.
HB 2307	Coleman, Jeff	<b>Human Trafficking</b>	Assesses an additional five thousand dollar fine for human trafficking offenses and establishes the "Human Trafficking and Sexual Exploitation Fund."
HB 2406	Person, Mike	<b>Human Trafficking</b>	Requires hospital employees to receive training on detecting and reporting human trafficking.
HB 1568 HB 1696 HB 1915 HB 1865	Sharp, Mark Reedy, Roger Schroer, Nick Rowland, Rory	<b>Safety</b>	Establishes Blair's Law, which creates the offense of unlawful discharge of a firearm for discharging a firearm within or into the limits of a municipality with criminal negligence.
HB 1589	Fitzwater, Travis	<b>Safety</b>	Adds that a person who has been found guilty of possession of child pornography shall not be within 500 feet of certain locations.
HB 1603	Pietzman, Randy	<b>Safety</b>	Requires certain sexual offenders to be electronically monitored while relocating to a different county or city not within a county.
HB 1655	Hicks, Ron	<b>Safety</b>	Prohibits certain individuals from possessing a firearm due to domestic violence.
HB 1944	Mackey, Ian	<b>Safety</b>	Establishes the "Compassionate Assistance for Rape Emergencies (CARE) Act". Defines the standard of care as informing the victim of the option to be provided emergency contraception at the hospital along with requiring the health care provider to provide sexually transmitted infection screening and treatment.
HB 1957 SB 923	Richey, Doug Brattin, Rick	<b>Safety</b>	Creates the "Protect Young Minds Online Act", which establishes requirements for Internet Service Providers to authenticate access to obscene websites when providing Internet service to subscribers
HB 2060	Sauls, Robert	<b>Safety</b>	Creates provisions relating to licensing centers for the treatment of sexually deviant behaviors.
HB 2112	Owen, Bill	<b>Safety</b>	Modifies provisions relating to sexual offenders.
HB 2118 SB 666	Taylor, Jered Burlison, Eric	<b>Safety</b>	Modifies and establishes provisions relating to the use of self-defense. <i>This bill is opposed by the MO Association of Prosecuting Attorneys.</i>
HB 2179	Proudie, Raychel	<b>Safety</b>	Establishes definitions that relate to the issuance of protective orders
HB 2223 HB 2489	Ingle, Keri Buchheit-Courtway	<b>Safety</b>	Provides that prosecutions for felony sexual offenses against any person may be commenced at any time.

HB 2258	Ingle, Keri	<b>Safety</b>	Establishes the offense of sexual contact with a child or incapacitated person.
HB 2478	Ingle, Keri	<b>Safety</b>	Establishes the "Enough is Enough Act", which requires that each institution of higher education adopt sexual assault policies, prominently display such policies on its website, and annually distribute copies of such policies to all enrolled students.
HB 2590	Evans, David	<b>Safety</b>	Modifies provisions relating to sexual offenses.
HB 2596	Cook, Bennie	<b>Safety</b>	Clarifies that any sentence for the offense of abuse or neglect of a child will be carried out in the Department of Corrections.
HB 2616	Coleman, Jeff	<b>Safety</b>	Modifies provisions relating to criminal offenses involving a child.
SB 751	Bernskeotter, Mike	<b>Safety</b>	Modifies provisions relating to location restrictions for certain offenders
SB 775	Rehder, Holly	<b>Safety</b>	Modifies provisions relating to prior sexual conduct of witnesses.
SB 1033	Rizzo, John	<b>Safety</b>	Modifies provisions relating to the unlawful possession of firearms.
