HB 2130	Coleman, Mary Elizabeth	<b>Safety</b>	This bill provides the state Auditor access to court records relating to convictions or guilty pleas for offenses requiring registration as a sex offender and charges filed for failure to register, to the extent necessary to conduct an audit. The Auditor must maintain confidentiality as it relates to closed records, pursuant to statute.
HB 2131	Beck, Doug	<b>Safety</b>	Prohibits certain individuals from possessing a firearm due to domestic violence protection orders.
HB 2134 SB 940	Lavender, Deb Schupp, Jill	<b>Safety</b>	Establishes extreme risk orders of protection, which prohibit certain persons from having firearms in their custody, control, or possession.
HB 2306	Schroer, Nick	<b>Safety</b>	Modifies the offense of endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree. This bill states that a person commits the offense of endangering the welfare of a child if they knowingly encourage, aid or cause a child under the age of 17 to engage in any conduct which violates the provisions of Chapter 571 or 579, RSMo.
HB 2396	Mackey, Ian	<b>Safety</b>	Establishes extreme risk protection orders and gun violence seizure warrants and prohibits certain persons involved in domestic violence from possessing a firearm.
HB 2439	Mackey, Ian	<b>Safety</b>	Establishes the "Compassionate Assistance for Rape Emergencies (CARE) Act"
SB 540	Walsh, Gina	<b>Safety</b>	Requires individuals who have been convicted of, or pled guilty to, certain offenses to register as a sex offender if the property stolen was sexual in nature.
HB 563	Schupp, Jill	<b>Safety</b>	Modifies provisions relating to the offense of unlawful possession of firearms.
SB 602	Luetkemeyer, Tony	<b>Safety</b>	Modifies provisions related to criminal offenses.
